## 3. Humanitarian Services:

We continue to raise funds for the Dhammarajika Orphanage in Bangladesh - this fundraising project has been continuing for 24 years.

We have started planning to create the means to care for the Aged and Dying based on Buddha Dhamma principles. Project commencement committee has been formed called 'Bodhicare'.

#### 4. Community Development:

We work to increase the awareness of Buddha Dhamma in the local community through PR in local Media, and attendance at peak local events: for example the Community Leaders Evening at the Shire of Yarra Ranges.

We have produced over 370 weekly Buddhist Hour radio broadcasts for over 7 years

on local station Knox Hillside Radio 88.0 FM.
