Three Day Chan Bhavana Course

A three Day Chan Bhavana Course was held at the centre over the Queen's Birthday long weekend, from Saturday 11 June to Monday 13 June 2011. The theme for the course was 'Joyful Effort' taught by Chan Teacher Melba Nielson.

Chan Master Melba Nielson led the Way of the Brush class between 11:00am and 1:00pm each day. Melba instructed us in Chan Painting, Flower Meditation, Ink Meditation and Presentation Mounting.

On the first day members requested to be taught Chan mind. Melba informed students that the essence of Chan was mindfulness. Members were taught a short two-minute meditation that involved gazing at a flower and watching the subsequent thoughts, sounds and feelings that arose in the mind. The intention of this meditation is to develop one's ability to let phenomena arise and fall without grabbing and grasping. The next meditation students were guided through was the mixing of the ink. As with looking at the flower, the aim is to 'not touch' the thoughts that arise and to keep one's mind and awareness on the body while making the ink that will be used to paint with. Melba told the students to mix ink like a sick patient and to paint like a lioness defending her cubs.

The subjects painted during the course were bamboo, mountains, rocks and orchids. Melba demonstrated how the four treasures (the brush, paper, ink and ink stone) work together to create the painting. She taught that for a student to access the Chan mind, one has to let go and have no concern for what ends up on the paper.

Melba encouraged her students to observe closely the minds behavior while painting. Melba was a supportive and inspirational teacher. We thank Melba for her kindness and skill in teaching Chan to the students through the Way of the Brush. Melba was very happy to help us and offered her continued support to the Buddhist Discussion Centre (Upwey) Ltd. All students received great benefit from the class.

Master John D Hughes Image Relocation

On Monday 13 June, at 2:30pm, students attending the three-day Chan Bhavana course assembled together in the dining room to move the John Hughes life size image from Anita's house into the Meditation hall.

Preparation for the move had begun several days before with chanting and offerings being made by all. The image, which is made with steel rods, concrete and plaster, had to be separated from the steel rods which were set in concrete in the ground under the house by Adam. A concrete platform and lotus leaf surround, which was placed under the image as a moon disc, was also removed. This was cleaned and repainted by Tanya and Romy.

The image weighs about 100 kg and took Adam, Sally, Simon, Romy, Julian and Frank together to successfully lift and move the image into the hall. The clothes, which had been washed and dry cleaned, were then sewn back onto the image by Melba, Romy and Sally.

New holes were drilled into the floor of the hall to

the left of the main altar. Finally at about 5.00pm the image was placed in its new home.

Many merits flowed from placing this tantric image of our Founder into the hall. Teachers and students of our Centre will benefit for many years to come. They will be able to make offerings, pay respect and make requests to Master John Hughes image and altar, which is now accessible to all.

Anita sent her heartfelt and deep gratitude for the effort made to safely move the John Hughes image to its new home. Well done all!
