WORLD FELLOWSHIP OF BUDDHISTS 2012 CONFERENCE – YEOSU CITY, SOUTH KOREA.

The World Fellowship of Buddhists 26th General Conference will be held from the 11th to the 16th of June 2012 in Yeosu City, South Korea.

The Conference Theme is: 21st Century Buddhist Ecological Environment Phenomenon and Practice, with the Sub-Theme: How to Effectively Convey Buddhist Spirit which is the essence of Oriental Ideology to the West.

Our Conference Team participants are: Frank Carter, Julian Bamford (Delegates), Simon Kearney and Nicole Moustakas (Observers).

Our team's journey commences early this Sunday morning the 10th of June when they depart from Melbourne airport. Thank you to Anita and Sally for providing transport to the airport.

Our team will arrive in Seoul Sunday night and stay in a hotel near the airport. The following morning they will undertake a four hour journey on the WFB courtesy bus to the port city of Yeosu, on Korea's beautiful South Coast, where the Conference will be held.
